HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION OF CLERKS OF DISTRICT COURT ******************************

The Association of the Clerks of District Court of Minnesota has been in existence for many years. The exact year of organization is not known, but according to information given to the Association a few years ago by Mr.S.C.Goff, a former Clerk of Steele County, association meetings were held in 1907 and earlier.

Three constitutions are recorded in the secretary's minutes. The first one is dated January 19, 1927. The second one is dated January 16, 1935. These two constitutions set out, among other things, that a meeting of the Association should be held every other year in the odd numbered years in the City of St.Paul. An amended constitution dated January 21, 1944 changes the constitution to provide for annual meetings and the place of meeting could be either St.Paul or Minneapolis.

The first secretary's minutes we have are for the January 25, 1927 convention.

Officers were elected for two-year terms and the president could not succeed himself in that office. The Clerks who have served as Association officers are as follows:
